**Pray:** Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

God of new life, the empty tomb shouts your love to all of creation. May we, with the women, go forth in joy, proclaiming your good news to all people, for the sake of our risen savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.



Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

<sup>7</sup>Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." <sup>8</sup>So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. (Matthew 28:7-8)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

Jesus is risen! With fear and great joy, Mary and Mary ran to tell the disciples what they had experienced.



**Connect:** Connect in conversation with others in your household.
