Pray: Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

Loving God, you sustained the church at Rome in their suffering through hope in the promise of your salvation. Give us this same hope, and walk with us through our own challenges, in Jesus Christ our savior. Amen.



Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us. (Romans 5:8)



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

Paul wrote to the Romans at a time when they were suffering greatly. Not to worry—their suffering could lead to endurance, character, and even hope.



Connect: Connect in conversation with others in your household.

- What was a high point of your day? What was a low point?
- How are communal sins different from individual sins? How are they alike? Which are worse? Why?
- How do you know God loves you? How is God's love evident in your daily life?
- For the littles: Who was the last person you said, "I'm sorry" to? What happened next? Jesus forgives us for all the mistakes we make.



Bless: Close your devotion with a blessing.

May God forgive your sin. Amen.
